Amy Jones

Amy graduated from Grapevine High School in 1987 and grew up in the Grapevine Colleyville area. While at GHS, Amy was Ms. Hurst Euless Bedford in the Texas Beauty Pageant and entertained people through her award-winning ventriloquist acts. At the age of 23, she ranked #1 in membership sales throughout the nation for the company she worked for at the time. Amy began motivational speaking as a time management expert with Zig Ziglar's national speaking team traveling the nation sharing her message with over 500,000 people. She shared the stage with other notable speakers such as Rudy Guliani, General Colin Powell, Larry King, Suze Orman, Dr. Robert Schuller, and Steve Forbes.

Through a period of trials where her husband was on the national missing persons list and disappeared from her life, Amy became passionate about sharing a message of hope with other women in crisis. She co-founded the non-profit The Journey of Sisters and became the Executive Director leading the organization to reach out and motivate and inspire others. Amy held a Master of Arts degree in Professional Development with a concentration in Leadership Studies, served on the Board of Trustees as President of the Women's Auxiliary Board at Dallas Baptist University. As the recipient of her local Chamber of Commerce's "Community Spirit Award" and "Corporate Citizenship Award" as well as the Texas state "Quality of Life Award," Amy exemplified a passion for building up and strengthening her community. Amy became a published author when her book, "How to Do Twice as Much in Half the Time," was distributed through Simple Truths Publishing in 2009.

On June 19, 2009 Amy passed away after battling kidney cancer. Her spirit can be captured in the words of Tom Ziglar, "For Amy life is about relationships, and so talking to people about what you believe in is really just about loving them and understanding their needs." She had a true passion of 'giving back' and helping others to succeed.

Atilla Penzes

Atilla graduated from Grapevine High School in 1986. He was born in Pennsylvania and moved to the Grapevine Colleyville area at the age of 10 in 1978. While at GHS, Atilla was very involved in the Student Council and was a member of Grapevine's first varsity soccer team. To some of his closest friends he went by the nickname "ATP", his initials and as you recall from your biology class also stands for Adenosine TriPhosphate which is the basis for energy cellular reactions in the bodies' muscle tissue. That was Atilla—high energy with a special knack for reaching out to people always with a finely honed wicked sense of humor and a smile.

After high school, Atilla attended The University of Mississippi (Ole Miss) graduating with a degree in Business Administration and a minor in marketing. At Ole Miss, Atilla was very involved in the fraternity Sigma Chi in community charitable events and campus social activities. Professionally, Atilla worked at Structures and Dillard's in New Orleans, and later as an Account Executive for Publishing Concepts LLC, consistently ranking as one of their top sellers of educational books to colleges, universities, and other public education organizations. His closest friends described him as someone full of life, always positive, affirming of others, and with a honed sense of wit that wouldn't quit.

After a strong battle with brain cancer, Atilla passed away at the age of 36 in October 2004 survived by his wife, Paisley, and children, Jackson and Zoe. Atilla did not meet people as strangers, because once he met you, you became his friend. Born of immigrant parents from Hungary, he had a true passion for life and giving back to others to make the world a better place.
